
An informational meeting was held to get an update on the fencing surrounding the Buckeye Pipeline and the area known as the Bay Ridge Branch Right of Way rail line which is operated by the New York Atlantic Railway. This area is leased by MTA/Long Island Railroad to New York Atlantic Railway.

In attendance were: representatives from the NYPD Homeland Security Unit, Louis Trimboli, Chair of the Civilian Emergency Response Team (CERT) for Boards 10 and 11, Dean Rasinya, CB10 Chair, Josephine Beckmann, District Manager and myself. Anna DeMetz had an excused absence.

The purpose of the meeting was to learn who is liable for maintaining and repairing existing fencing around this vast property and who is responsible for providing replacement tamper-proof fencing known as no cut/no climb fencing. Homeland Security representatives have met with the NYC Department of Transportation, Metropolitan Transit Authority and New York City Parks.

The subcommittee is planning a follow-up meeting in March with the responsible parties from each agency to ensure that Buckeye pipeline fencing repair is addressed.
